atta Bhagat, President of All India Marathi Natya Sammelan (2006) has had very rich and widely recognized career in the domain of Marathi theatre and drama. To begin with, he wrote short stories but soon devoted himself to theatre and writing of one act plays. His one act play Aavart brought him laurels and people recognized his talents as a dramatist. A host of collections of his one act plays soon followed. Reputed critics, men of theatre and senior dramatists realized his extraordinary achievements because his fulllength plays like Ashmak, Khelia were liked and successfully produced. However his play Wata-palwata (1986) translated into English as Routes and Escape Routes won him wide acclaim and critics praised him for his dramatic art. The play deals with three generations of a Dalit family and the changes brought about by the participation of their members in the Dalit movement. In a sense, the play began with the work of Dr. Ambedkar. Essentially a man of theatre, Prof. Datta Bhagat produced, directed and wrote for a theatre group in Nanded of which he was the pivot.

Bhagat's plays show a very subtle understanding of the reality of caste relations in our society. His plays portray the pain and suffering of the lowliest of the low and present a variety of Dalit problems with imagination and rare acumen. It is true that he has been recognized as a distinct Dalit voice in modern Dalit theatre. But such assessment would be blind to his immense contribution to Marathi drama and theatre as a whole. The naturalist theatre and drama in Marathi for a long time belonged to the upper castes and the middle class. Prof. Bhagat makes creative use of these conventions and brilliantly explodes them from within. He brings a set of original themes that the traditional drama cannot sustain. Thus he gives Marathi drama and its performance a new turn that makes our society aware of the complexities of human relations dominated by caste considerations. His contributions have proved pathbreaking.

Datta Bhagat has also written significant criticism from time to time. He has written on the Dalit movement, Dalit literature and on Marathi literature as a whole. His criticism is characterized by painstakingly amassed evidence, reason and sobriety of judgement. He is not only a writer of great distinction but also an activist for social causes that appeal to his mind

and heart. He has deep faith in Buddhist philosophy and happens to be a keen student of Buddhism.

Datta Bhagat was honoured as an ideal teacher in 1997 by the

Government of Maharashtra. A very powerful and persuasive speaker, he earned wide reputation as a teacher and awards and honours came to him automatically.
