D.Naveen, popularly known as Ampashayya Naveen, was born on 24 December 1941 in a middle class agricultural family at Vaavilala, a village in the district of Warangal. As his birth place was the centre of many historical events, Naveen's childhood witnessed some major social struggles such as Telangana Peasants' Armed struggle against the rule of Nizam. The deep impact of the struggle between the haves and the have nots during Ninteen Forties made him write *Kala Rekhalu*, the novel which won the Sahitya Akademi Award in 2004. *Kala Rekhalu* is his socio-autobiographical novel based on the Telangana struggle against the imperialist regime. In this novel, Naveen uniquely picturises the struggle of the suppressed humanity and successfully encapsulates the sentiments of the populace in the throes of liberating themselves.

Since childhood Naveen had inclination towards literature and great fascination for Burra Katha, Hari Katha and the street plays based on the *Mahabharatha* and the *Ramayana*. When he was in fourth class he wrote his first short story which was published in *Chandamama*. Finishing the primary education at his native place and its neighbouring villages Naveen left for the town of Warrangal for high school studies. He was admitted to A.V. High school at Warangal. The reputed teachers in the school encouraged Naveen to cherish and grow the creative writer in him. He did his matriculation in 1957 and undergraduation in 1962 from Arts & Science College at the same place.

In his college days the writings of contemporary Telugu writers like Chalam, Bucchibabu, Vishwanatha Satyanarayana, Sri Sri, Kodavatiganti Kutumbarao, Gopichand, Rachakonda Vishwanatha Sastri inspired him. In the same period of time he also read Hardy, Dickens, Aldous Huxley, Russel, Tolstoy, Dostoyevsky and Gorkey. From all these writers he acquired the art of story telling. Naveen did his M.A. in Economics from Osmania University, Hyderabad in 1964 after which he held many prestigious positions in various Government Colleges in Andhra Pradesh.

His literary career began in the late Sixties with his path-breaking novel Ampashayya (1969) in which he successfully employed the stream of consciousness technique. His novels Ampashayva, Mullapodalu and Antasravanthi, called the "Ravi Trilogy", have brought the stream of consciousness technique to near perfection in Telugu fiction. Depicting the life of the university students and emphasizing the psychoeconomic factors, Ampashayya (1969) portrays just sixteen hours in the life of a student who stays in a hostel. Mullapodalu (1976), shows how the educated unemployed youth are drawn to various movements like Naxalism. Antasravanthi (1991) depicts the married and professional life of the protagonist Ravi. Vichalita (1976) depicts how a woman committing adultery is punished by the society while a man doing the same sin is excused. Cheekati Rojulu (1979) is an epistemological novel which depicts the atrocities committed by the police on innocent writer during the emergency days of 1975. Prayanamulo Pramadaalu (1987) is a novel written in the form of a travelogue. The exciting experiences and troublesome encounters of fifty young girls and their lecturer Rajeshwari who are on an excursion party in south India form the plot of this novel. The different viewpoints of a reporter, a police officer, the victim and the quack about the rape in a dental clinic, are captured in a new narrative technique in his novel Drukkonaalu (1999). His novels Bandhayyaalu(2001) and Raktakaasaaram(2001) give a realistic view of the social and family relationships that are affected in the Telangana region due to the movements like Naxalism, Separate Telangana Agitation, etc. from 1956 to 1995.

Naveen has written more than fifty short stories and twenty-eight widely acclaimed novels and several essays and he stands in the galaxy of Telugu literary giants like Vaddera Chandidas, Keshava Reddy, Rachakonda Vishwanatha Sastri, Vasireddy Seethadevi and Dasarathi Rangacharya. His latest trilogy comprises the novels Kala Rekhalu, Chedirina Svapnaalu and Baandhavyaalu.

"If the first trilogy brought to Telugu novel the essentially Joyce-like modernist experimentalism and inward-looking absorption of the self, the trilogy that appeared nearly thirty years later is typically post-modernist reintegration of the self with the socio-historical matrix. The path that these two trilogies trace, with scores of the other novels and stories in between, is also the trajectory of Naveen's contemporaneity and his seismographic sensibility...His writings speak for a generation that has come of age in the Sixties, straddling the two worlds of pre and post independence India to the present times. In the path-breaking novels like Ampashayya, Cheekati Rojulu and Kala Rekhalu Naveen has come to stand for experimentation, courage of conviction, sensitivity and liberal outlook..." these were the words of compliment spoken by Professor Chandrakant Kokate, Vice-Chancellor of Kakatiya University, Warangal, when Naveen was awarded the Doctor of Letters (Honoris Causa) by the Kakatiya University on 29th March 2004.

Naveen has also contributed many articles on films such as "Satyajit Ray's Apu Trilogy", "Gurajada Kanyasulkam as a movie" and articles on eleven outstanding films Casablanca, Gone with the Wind, Seven Samurai, Pather Panchali, Do Bigha Zamin, Sound of Music, to name a few.

Many of his novels and stories have been translated into English, Hindi, Kannada, Marathi and Tamil. Naveen has reviewed more than

hundred books in Telugu and English. A number of seminars and research works have been conducted on Naveen's writings.

Professor G.V. Subrahmanyam compliments, "Naveen is the psychiatrist for Telugu novel. Stream of Consciousness is his specialisation."

"Naveen has ascended the peaks both as critic and a creative writer, and he has chosen novel as his subject for both creation and criticism", says Dr. Mudigonda Veerabhadraiah.
