




Rajan Gavas





ajan Gavas is one of the most eminent writers in M a r a t h i . H e h a s contributed to Marathi literature by successfully handling various literary genres like novel, poetry, short-story and non-fictional prose also during the last four decades. A genuinely sensitive writer of typically rural background, he stands tall amongst contemporary Marathi writers of the day.

His highly active association with the devdasi movement in the border area of Karnataka and Maharashtra for a long time apparently influenced his creative writing. His keen awareness of social issues and special sensitivity to the social problems of devdasis can clearly be witnessed in his early novels. He is also involved in various innovative educational reforms.

He broke new grounds with his early novels like Chaundka (1985) and Bhandarbhog (1989). These two novels are marked with exceptional portrayal of the agonized world of devdasis entirely unknown until then to Marathi readers. Basically, in these novels, he has depicted the inner world of exploited devdasis and the trauma of devdasi class still burning even in the 20th century India, and has critically emphasized the role of religion in controlling the devdasi women. Written in a humanistic approach, these novels mirror the social aspects of the oppressed devdasis. Jogawa, widely acclaimed Marathi film is the adaptation of his novels, Chaundka and Bhandarbhog.

The major concern of his writings is the changing contemporary rural culture. His novels Dhingana, Kalap and Tanakat deal with the changing rural life and culture. They have successfully encapsulated the inner turmoil of the educated, frustrated youth of the day. His

novels express his exceptional sensibility to the rural culture of Maharashtra. These novels come up with his brilliant insights into changing social values, power relations and conflicts. His novel Tanakat has won the Sahitya Academic Award in 2001.

Like his novels, his short stories also are marked with his distinctive style. They are based on contemporary agrarian culture existed especially in villages. The distinctive qualities of his fiction are nativism, experimentation with themes and narrative techniques, and humanistic approach to the

deprived social classes. His exemplarily humanistic attitude towards women is explicitly reflected in his writings. He depicts the world of traditional Indian women, their predicament, and their role as binding, supporting forces of the family, and images of rebellious women.

The world in his short stories is marked with his affection for rural culture, the new tensions of the contemporary society with mesmerizing gallery of characters, typical dialects of the border region of Maharashtra, and Karnataka.

His widely acclaimed essays

included in three collections entitled Kachakavadya, Kaifiyat and Local to Global, were serially published in the reputed Marathi newspapers and periodicals. This writing is a spontaneous response to the various social events happening in the surrounding area and reflects his global value-based approach. He has also written two critical books on the contribution of Bhau Padhye, distinguished Marathi Marathi fiction writer, to Marathi Literature. He has edited books on two important Marathi writers of post-60s - Bhalchandra Nemade and Ranganath Pathare.

His novels Tanakat and Bandarbhog and some short stories are Kannada, Urdu. translated in Tamil, Punjabi, Hindi and Assamesse. He has worked for various prestigious literary institutions and organizations and academic bodies. He has also worked as Member, Marathi Advisory Board, Sahitya Akademi, Maharashtra Foundation, Language Advisory Committee, Government of Maharashtra, Maharashtra State and Language Development Society. He was President of second Annabhau Sathe Sahitya Sammelan held in

2010. He is the chief editor of the journal entitled *Parivartanacha Murali*.

Gavas has always been encouraging budding writers. He has immensely contributed to the activities creating healthy atmosphere for creatively encapsulating the problems of present society in literature.

His literature mirrors sociocultural scenario of the last four decades with changing rural culture, inevitable attack of globalization, protest in villages, and depiction of the world of the women. His multifaceted literary writing has become a milestone in Modern Marathi literature.
