ahamahopadhyaya Prof. Prasad Rewa Dwivedi, popularly known 'Sanatanakavi,' was born in 1935 in village Nadner, district Sihore (Madhya Pradesh). He began learning Sanskrit from his father in his childhood from the holy verses of Vishnusahastranam. After completing his school education in Nadner, he came to Kashi (Varanasi) in 1950 to obtain higher education in Sanskrit under late Pt. Mahadev Shastri, a leading scholar of that time. He obtained all his degrees namely Shastri (Sahitya, 1953), Acharya (Sahitya, 1956) and M.A. (Sanskrit Literature, 1959) from Banaras Hindu University (BHU), achieving first class first rank throughout. He obtained his Ph D degree in 1965 from Ravishankar University, Raipur on commentary Hemadri's Raghuvamsa-'Darpana.' In 1974, Rani Durgavati Vishvavidyalaya, Jabalpur conferred upon him D.Litt. (Sanskrit) degree for his works on the Alamkara and Dhvani schools of Sanskrit Poetics.

Dwivedi started his academic career as a Lecturer and then Assistant of Sanskrit, M.P. Professor Government from 1959-1970. He was Reader Sanskrit Sahitya, Faculty of Sanskrit Learning and Theology (presently Sanskrit Vidya Dharm Vigyan Sankay, SVDV) at BHU from 1970-77; Professor 1977-95; Head of the Sahitya Department 1970-1990; Dean of the SVDV faculty 1979-1981, 1985-1987, 1987-1989; Emeritus Fellow, UGC during 1991-92; lifetime Emeritus Professor (Sanskrit) since 1993. He is the founder of Kalidasa Sansthan (KS), a 'Centre for Excellence in Sanskrit Poetics, Varanasi, a non-profit charitable organization, where he devotes his time for free education to students on rare texts of Sanskrit poetics, preservation and publication of Kalidasa Literature, and a wide range of editions and publications in Sanskrit Literature along with his younger son Dr Sadashiv Kr. Dwivedi, who is carrying the torch of excellence in Sanskrit forward from his eminent father along with his younger sister Dr Shobha Mishra, who teaches at the Dept. of Sanskrit, VSSD College, Kanpur.

Professor Dwivedi has propounded new theories in the field of Sanskrit Poetics and Dramaturgy in his treatises. The new theories in the field of Sanskrit poetics propounded by Prof. Dwivedi are (i) Alamkara is the true soul of poetry; (ii) Dhvani has no historical and logical base and is not acceptable at all; (iii) Reshaped the history of Sanskrit poetics (2005); (iv) Both the two devices differ from each other - Literature and Language; (v) The Theory: Alam bhava is the real Alamkara; (vi) Introduced the Four Dhama and Five Kalpa theory in the history of Sanskrit poetics; (vii) Working on the Dhara school of Bhoja etc. Professor Dwivedi has given support to Vedic theme of Alamkara as the soul of poetry, Rasa is included in it. Dhvani School is proved as a non-Vedic emotional slogan and he has uprooted its theories with fresh objections. In the field of poetics Prof. Dwivedi presents a fresh assessment of poetic elements and experience on new grounds in his treatise Kavyalamkarakarika, published in 1977 with Sanskrit gloss and English translation.

Professor Dwivedi has written 3 epies, 21 lyries, 2 dramas and several poems in Sanskrit. He has composed over twelve thousand Sanskrit verses in various meters and many other

poems like Brahmastram on the occasion of 50th Year of India's Independence in 1999; Kutannatah, the lyric poetry written by the poet on the present day situation in 1997. He has written three Sanskrit stories namely Tripadi, Kasya Dosah & Kosau, published in the Sanskrit Pratibha magazine of Sahitya Akademi, New Delhi, Professor Dwivedi has edited for the first time complete text of Kalidasa Literature on the basis of 300 manuscripts, including those preserved in Harvard University, and critical editions published from all over the world under the title Kalida-sagranthavali (1976, 1986 from BHU and with Hindi translation in 2007 in two volumes from Kalidasa Sanskrit Academy, Ujjain).

Professor Dwivedi is a poet, dramatist, critic, editor and above all a deep scholar of Sanskrit poetics and dramaturgy. For his extraordinary contribution to Sanskrit literature and poetics he was honoured with 'The Certificate of Honour' (President Award) by the President of India on 15th August, 1978, a lifetime achievement award at the age of just 42. Adding to the prestige of the President Award, Prof. Dwivedi also received Sahitya Akademi Award in 1991; Kalpavalli Puraskara from Bharatiya Bhasa Parishad, Calcutta in 1993; Vacaspati Puraskara by K.K. Birla Foundation, New Delhi in 1997; Srivani Alamkarana by R.J. Dalmiya Shrivani Nyas, New Delhi, in 1999 (all of these four awards for his original epic Svatantryasambhavam); Visista Puraskara from U.P. Sanskrit Sansthan in 2002; Valmiki Puraskara from U.P. Sanskrit Sansthan in 2004;

Vishva Bharati Puraskar from U.P. Sanskrit Sansthan in 2005; nine different Awards on books by the Government of M.P. & U.P., including two Mitra Puraskaras, Bhojapuraskara and Vyasapuraskara from Govt. of M.P.; Nana Saheb Peshwa Dharmika and Adhyatmika Puraskara, Devadeveshvara Sansthana, Pune, 2010; Rashtriya Sanskrit Veda Vyas Puraskara of 2005 conferred by University Grants Commission, 2010; Smt. Chandravati Joshi Sanskrit Bhasha Puraskara, 2009 conferred by Shri Gyan Kalyana Datavya Nyasa, New Delhi, 2010; and Maharsi Vedavyas Samman, Sanskrit Academy, 2012. Professor Dwivedi has also received several honorary titles like Mahamahadhyapaka. 1978; Mahamahopadhyaya, 1999, 2003, 2009; Abhinava-Kalidasa, 2003; Ratnasadasya of Kalidas Sanskrit Academy, Ujjain, 2007; Panditaratna, 2008; Shastrakalanidhi, 2006; Sahityaratna, 2010; Pragyabharati, 2010; Shastrarthasri, 2012 from various renowned institutions all over the country.

On the international front, Prof. Dwivedi was the convener of the V⁰ World Sanskrit Conference, BHU, Varanasi, 1981. He attended the VI^e World Sanskrit Conference, 1984 at Philadelphia, USA as Govt. of India delegate and VIIth World Sanskrit Conference, Leiden, Holland, 1986 as a member of the delegation of BHU; visited Nepal as a specially invited scholar, 1994; chaired two research sessions in XVth World Sanskrit Conference, 2012, New Delhi. Professor Dwivedi visited US scholars and institutions in the USA in 1996 and 2002 including Harvard University for his research.
