Temsula Ao





Born in October 1945 in Jorhat, Assam, Temsula matriculated from Ridgeway Girls High School, Golaghat, Assam. Later she graduated with distinction from Fazl Ali College, Mokokchung, Nagaland. After taking her Master's degree in English from Guwahati University, Assam she did her postgraduate Diploma in the teaching of English from CIEFL (Central Institute of English and Foreign Languages) Hyderabad and later her PhD. from North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong.

Temsula joined, NEHU in 1975 as a lecturer and later she was appointed as Head, Department of English and Dean, School of Humanities and Education. She also served as the Director, North East Zonal Cultural Centre, Dimapur for five years.

Temsula's first publication was her collection of poems Songs that Tell in 1988. Her works have been majorly shaped by oral tradition and myths, the creative intersection between folk narratives, poetry and fiction.

Temsula's foray into the world of creative writing was with poetry. However poetry she admits is demanding and she went back to it later again. Meanwhile in her feverish quest for creative exactness she started writing short stories in between her busy

teaching career. However she did not let her poetry languish and has till now published five collections of poetry. Finding a close parallel and synergy between poetry and songs, she titled her poetry collection *Songs that Tell* and *Songs that Try to Sing*.

Her short story collection These Hills Called Home – Stories from a War Zone (2006) and Laburnum for my Head have been received wide critical claim. The anthology of short stories, These Hills Called Home: Stories from a War Zone is eloquent proof that the violent phase in Naga life will remain etched in their collective memory. Her stories have a gripping quality that forces the reader to read them at one go. The stories mostly revolve around women, who in any case, have to bear the brunt of violence.

prestigious Padmashri in 2007 for both literature and Education, the Nagaland Governor's Award for distinction in Literature in 2009 and the Sahitya Akademi Award in 2013. Her works have been widely translated into Assamese, Bengali,

Oriya, Kannada and German.

Temsula Ao, has widely travelled in India and abroad as part of writers' delegation to China, Switzerland, UK and Buenos Aires. She is currently the chairperson Nagaland State Commission for Women, Nagaland, Kohima.
