

Yashwant Manohar





Rose to eminence with his first collection of poems entitled Utthangumpha in 1977, Yashwant Manohar is acknowledged as a major poet in Marathi literary world today. He courageously expressed his sentiment against fanaticism, the caste hierarchy, superstitions, social oppression and also voiced for equality, liberty, fraternity through his literary works.

Born in a remote village, weltering in poverty and penury, called Yerala in 1943, Yashwant started writing poems and songs of social reformation in 1956. His writings are fiery charged with revolutionary spirit. Bhalachandra Phadke, an eminent critic called Manohar's poetry 'a volcano of uprising'. He spoke for the upliftment of the down-trodden.

Yashwant suffered many hardships during his childhood days. He did his schooling up to fourth class at Yerala and, later, a nearby town five miles away from his village. He developed love for reading books and inclination to voice his views while he was in sixth class. After completing his matriculation, he did his graduation in Milind College, Aurangabad, the college founded by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar. It was there his literary talents found expression in the company of the distinguished litterateurs such as M. N. Wankhede, R. G. Jadhay and Bhalachandra Phadke, He intensely read Charvak, Buddha, Socrates, Marx, Sartre, Richards, Babasaheb Ambedkar, histories of Indian and the Western philosophy during this period. He began to understand the foundations of the

struggle risen on account of economic and social inequality. Yashwant's deep faith in the ideologies and views of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar and Mahatma Phule kept alive his optimism and creativity even in the days of penury. His passion for reading and love for literature relieved him of the frustration came out of poverty and hunger.

After completing his graduation with a first class, he did his M.A. in Marathi language and literature from the Marathwada University, Aurangabad under the tutorship of veteran Marathi critics Sudhir Rasal, V.L. Kulkarni and Y.M. Pathan. His poetic genius found a fresh breath in the lively literary and cultural environment in Aurangabad. His views on untouchability, the caste system, social oppression and the humiliation meted out by the social underdogs found verbal expression. His poetic sensibility is of two edged sword, one of tears of agony and the other, fiery revolt.

Manohar began his career as a lecturer teaching Marathi literature

at Pratishthan College, Paithan and later, joined Nagpur College, Nagpur where Sharadchandra Muktibodh, veteran Marathi poet, fiction writer and critic, was head of the Marathi department. Besides teaching Marathi literature to the students, he had instilled in them a deep sense of social reformation.

Sri Manohar has been prolific, ceaselessly writing eversince he started as writer. He has seven collections of poems, 32 books of literary thoughts, three novels, 23 books of criticism, three nonfictional works, four collections of letters and a travelogue to his credit. He is known for his judicious worldview and deep sense of social commitment. According to Purushottam Patil, an eminent Marathi poet, who said "Yashwant Manohar is to Marathi what Dostoyevsky is to Russian." Celebrated Marathi writers such as P.L. Deshpande, Baburao Bagul, M.S. Patil, Narhar Kurundkar, Vasant Abaji Dahake, Janardan Waghmare, Sambhaji Kadam praised Sri Manohar's multidimensional personality attributing him 'a distinguished contemporary Marathi writer'. Kusumagraj, an eminent Marathi poet writes in one of his letters to Yashwant Manohar: "To read your poems was an overwhelming experience. It was like being in the tongues of fire. Your command of the language and mastery over diction are exceptional. Your poetry is not merely an electric lamp but also a thunderbolt in the sky..."

Yashwant Manohar is a pragmatic intellectual for whom Babasaheb Ambedkar is the sole inspiration for his creative endeavour. Sri Manohar is associated with several social organizations that includes Samajik Samata Samiti, Ek Gaav Ek Paanwatha, etc. Yashwant Manohar had been a Member of Marathi Advisory Board, Sahitya Akademi and also the President of Maharashtra Rajya Sahitya Sanskriti Mandal. He was also a Member of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Grantha Prakashan Samiti and Maharashtra Rajya Marathi Vikas Samstha.

The awards and honours Sri Manohar has received are the Maharashtra State Government Award (four times), Phule-Ambedkar Sahitya Panchayat Award, Bhalachandra Phadke Award, Padmashree Vikhe Patil Award, Parivartanwaadi Sahityik Award, Indira Sant Award (twice), etc.

Presently, Sri Manohar is working on the 'History of Modern Marathi Literature', a project sponsored under the Writers' Residency Scheme by Sahitya Akademi.
